



SNOWFLAKES

EAR WARMER

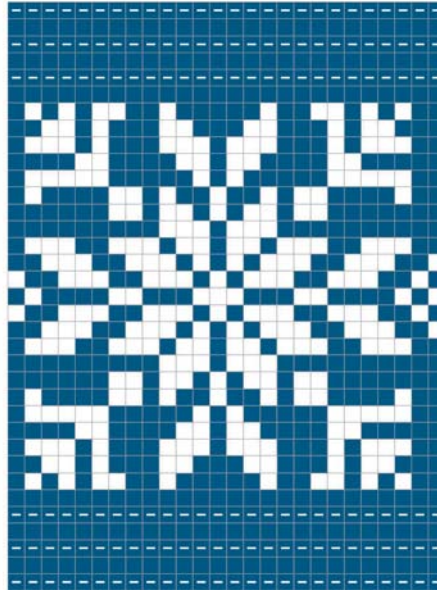
Notes

2 colours of yarn used: base colour (marine blue), and 1 contrast colour (white)

2.5mm circular needle and 2-ply wool

Instructions

1. Cast on 130 stitches with base colour.
2. Start with 5 round edging: starting with a purl round, work alternate rounds of knit and purl for 5 rounds.
3. Continue following chart for the colour pattern. Read chart from right to left.
4. Continue with same edging as at start: starting with a purl round, work alternate rounds of knit and purl for 5 rounds.
5. Cast off all stitches.
6. Sew in ends to finish.





PINK ROSE HAT

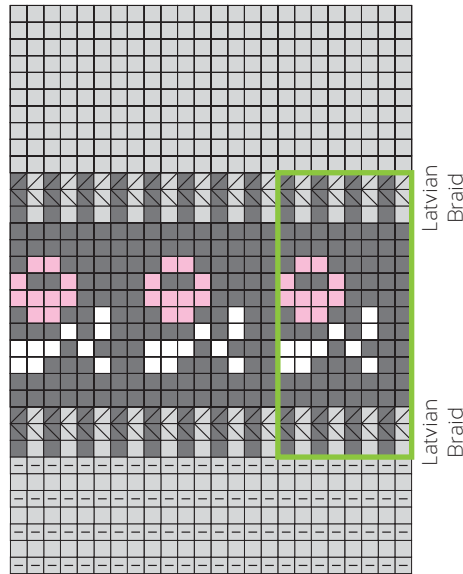
Notes

4 colours of yarn used: base colour (pearl grey), and 3 contrast colours (dark grey, white and pink)

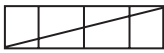
2.5mm circular needle and 2-ply wool

Instructions

1. Cast on 120 stitches with base colour.
2. Start with garter edging: starting with a purl round, work alternate rounds of knit and purl for 7 rounds.
3. Continue with Latvian Braid (see Special Techniques).
4. Continue following chart for colour pattern (11 rounds). Read chart from right to left.
5. Continue with Latvian Braid.
6. Continue with base colour and knit 36 rounds.
7. Place stitch markers to divide stitches into 5 sections of 24 stitches.
8. Now work alternate decrease round and plain round as follows, until 20 sts remain:
 - **Decrease round:** work (knit 1, skpo, knit to 3 sts before next marker, k2tog, knit 1) five times.
 - **Plain round:** knit all stitches.



9. K2tog all around. 10 sts
10. Cut the yarn leaving a long tail. Using a sewing needle, thread the tail through final 10 stitches and tighten. Then pull tail to inside the hat and secure.
11. Sew in ends to finish.

INSTRUCTIONS	CHART SYMBOL
Slipped stitch – Slip the stitch from the left needle to the right needle, as if to purl, without knitting it. This can be used to create a two-coloured pattern when the previous row (and therefore the slipped stitches) is a different colour.	
3-into-3 – Insert the right needle into back of next 3 stitches and knit them together without dropping them off the left needle. Wrap the yarn around the right needle, then knit into the back of the same 3 stitches again, this time dropping them off the left needle.	
C4B (cable back over 4 stitches) – Slip next 2 stitches onto a cable needle, hold at back of work, knit next 2 stitches then knit 2 stitches from cable needle (for a right slanting cable).	
YO (yarn over) – Wrap the yarn over the needle to add an extra stitch.	

P2tog (purl 2 stitches together) – Insert the right needle into the next 2 stitches on left needle purlwise and purl them together as one stitch.

M1 (make 1 stitch) – Insert the left needle under the bar between stitches from front to back and lift it to create a loop. Knit into the back of this loop.

Stocking stitch (stockinette) – Work stocking stitch in the round by knitting every round. Work stocking stitch flat by alternating between knit rows and purl rows.

Garter stitch – Work garter stitch in the round by alternating between knit rounds and purl rounds. Work garter stitch flat by knitting every row.
