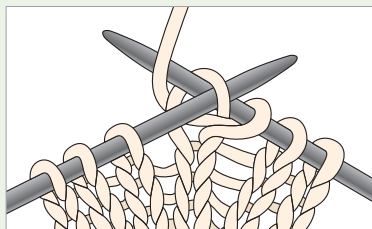
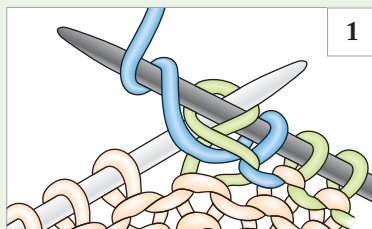


kfb (Knit into the front and back)

Knit into the front of the next stitch on LH needle. Instead of slipping the original stitch off the needle, knit into it again through the back loop. Then slip the original stitch off LH needle. This increases by one stitch.

**pfb (Purl into the front and back)**

Purl into the front of the next stitch on LH needle. Instead of slipping the original stitch off the needle, take the working yarn to the back of the work and knit into the stitch through the back loop. Then slip original st off LH needle. This increases by one stitch.

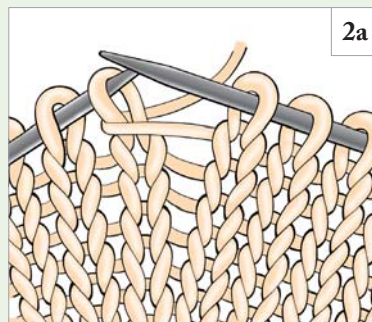
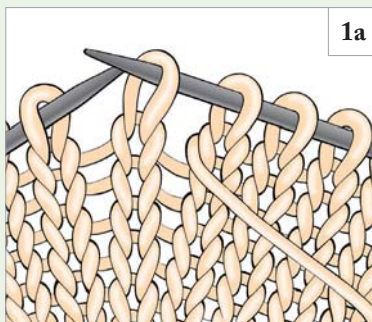
**Short Rows – Wrap and Turn**

On a knit row:

1a. Bring working yarn to front of work, slip next stitch purl-wise onto RH needle. Take working yarn to back of work.

2a. Slip the wrapped stitch back onto LH needle. Turn the knitting to work back in the other direction.

Note: There is no need to pick up the wraps on subsequent rows for these patterns.



On a purl row:

1b. Take working yarn to back of work, slip next stitch purl-wise onto RH needle. Bring working yarn to the front of the work.

2b. Slip the wrapped stitch back onto LH needle. Turn the knitting to work back in the other direction.

Note: There is no need to pick up the wraps on subsequent rows for these patterns.
